#### Some highlights from our interview with Dr. Seelaender:


An achievement she is most proud of: "nothing makes me prouder than the success of my former students and knowing that I managed to open some doors for them."

Health disparities and limited access to healthcare in many regions of Brazil motivate Mila to study cancer cachexia. "Cachexia is more common than in other countries, because patients present with more advanced disease... malnutrition is present throughout Brazil, further complicating the already complex management of cancer"

"Do not fall into the trap that you cannot have a family and still be an outstanding scientist. As a woman with 3 children, I can assure you my productivity and recognition are not below that of my colleagues who are men."

Jeannette Villepreux-Power (1794 - 1871) invented the modern aquarium for observing and describing octopuses and argonauts solving the long mystery of how argonauts make their distinctive egg cases.
